What is Holistic Management?

The natural world is comprised of beautiful and infinitely-complex living systems. Land, animals, people, plants, fungi, and more—are all interconnected and in relationship with each other. Holistic Management is a new decision-making framework that enables us to make the best decisions amidst the complexity of these living systems.


How Holistic Management can help you.

Holistic Management introduces new ecological insights that enable a shift in thinking. These insights help the land steward to make common sense decisions within a holistic context of their own creation to regenerate environments from an ecological, economic, and social perspective. Altogether, Holistic Management equips us to understand the "whole" under our stewardship and enables is to make decisions that bring forth abundant outcomes, regenerating life for all involved.

To help in this learning process we have a suite of planning procedures that enable decision-makers to manage and monitor their decisions on the ground. They include Holistic Planned Grazing, Holistic Land Planing, Holistic Financial Planning and Holistic Ecological Monitoring.







Holistic Planned Grazing

Holistic Planned Grazing (HPG), is about getting animals to the right place at the right time with the right behavior for the right reasons.

Despite best efforts, most of us cannot deal with more than a few variables at once, and none of us can plan the complexity involved in managing livestock to regenerate grasslands and livelihoods using only our memory, a notebook, or calendar.

With HPG, grazing planning is done on a chart following simple steps in a specific order. Every possible consideration is addressed one-by-one and recorded on the grazing chart. The moves of the animals are then plotted to ensure that animals are where they need to be at the right time, and with the right behavior (based on the desired outcomes).

Holistic Land Planning

Holistic Land Planning helps you create the ideal layout of infrastructure for a grazing operation. Holistic Land planning and Holistic Planned Grazing developed in tandem as both grew out of our new understanding about the role of time in grazing and trampling.



To keep large herds of animals moving continually requires new thinking about the way we lay out infrastructure, especially in a communal or pastoral context where fencing may not be possible or desirable.. The planning of water points, roads, and handling facilities become especially important when you're dealing with large tracts of land that require a considerable investment in that sort of infrastructure.







Holistic Financial Planning

Good financial management is essential in any business that seeks to be viable and profitable. Regenerative agriculture producers have an additional requirement and that is to ensure that the means to achieving viability and profit also generates ecological wealth.

By integrating this simple-to-use, cash-based financial planning process into your current accounting and budgeting systems, you will not only be able to increase your profits, but also improve your quality of life and your land's health and productivity.

Holistic Ecological Monitoring

Our Holistic Ecological Monitoring empowers land stewards with the knowldge and understanding to be able to "read the land" and as such be able to better manage the ecosystem processes.

Ecological Outcome Verification[™] (EOV[™]) is a protocol for monitoring land health, giving a holistic look at both leading and lagging indicators.



In addition to providing an outcome-based verification of the health of the land base, EOV also provides critical intelligence to the farmer as a steward and manager of the land. By recognizing both land regeneration targets and trends, EOV endorsement and associated incentives are bestowed as long as land health moves in a net positive direction.

EOV measures regeneration through a host of ecological indicators

The 3200-hectare Dimbangombe Ranch near Victoria Falls, on which ACHM is based, also serves as one of two global campuses for the Savory Institute. It is living proof of the effectiveness of Holistic Management and Holistic Planned Grazing in a brittle and pastoral context. It is home to a large wildlife population, a mixed herd of cattle and goats, and an ever-improving landscape. As the birthplace of Holistic Management, the Dimbangombe Campus hosts annual training programs for Savory's Network of Hub leaders and Accredited Professionals, community leaders, NGO staff, and policymakers. The programs use the curriculum developed with Savory Institute to address the specific needs and context of subsistence farmers living and grazing on communal lands.





We know that most small-scale farmers would like to lower their input costs and increase their crop yields. In this course week, we help farmers understand the value of integrating livestock into their cropping plans. Farmers have used the impact of animals to double crop yields and significantly reduce input costs (when compared to community control fields). 

Dimbangombe Ranch Tours

Our ranch tours are for visitors that want to learn about the fascinating history of Dimbangombe ranch, which is intimately intertwined with Allan Savory and Holistic Management. Dimbangombe is a learning and demonstration site that is the home of Holistic Management.

After watching Allan Savory's TED talk and getting a little history of the ranch, we also provide a little introduction to Holistic Management. We visit the TED Talk sites and a few other important areas that help tell the story of this remarkable ranch in the western corner of Zimbabwe.

We will visit the Dimbangombe cattle herd (if is in an accessible area), and the herding team will show you the ranch's Holistic Grazing Plan. It will be an opportunity to walk and talk with the herding team on the ground. The ranch is in the heart of the Kavango Zambezi Trans-Frontier Conservation Area, so team will demonstrate how we manage the cattle herd amongst all the iconic African animals, including its large predators.
